You may not feel like a Christian every day, but following Jesus isn't based on feelings; it's based on the fact that Jesus died on the cross for your sins and that you now have a relationship with Him.

What should I do now that I follow Jesus?

1 John 5:11-13 says that God wants you to be sure of your salvation. So, take a moment to look up that verse in your Bible and think about what it means.

Romans 10:9 says, "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." God always keeps His promises and He never goes back on his word.

A promise is only as good as the person who makes it, and you can trust God to keep His!

I Corinthians 1:9 says, "God, who has called you into fellowship with his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, is faithful." God will do what He said He will do. He's reliable and trustworthy. He will not change His mind and kick you out of the family.

## TRUSTING GOD'S PROMISES IN HIS WORD

#### SUPER NEWS

When you became a Christian, God sent His Spirit to live in your heart. **Ephesians**1:13-14 says that the Spirit is like *a*contractual seal. In Bible days, an official seal was placed on a contract between people to guarantee that it was legitimate. **NEWS THAT'S ACTUALLY WORTH SHARING** 

People love to share good news! If you get a new job, have a new baby, or get married, that's probably news that you want to share. People don't keep good news to themselves.

In that same way, becoming a Christian is exciting news, and you should be excited to tell others right away. Your life has been changed by God, and God wants you to tell others about that change. Think about how important that is, and think about how many people need to hear about it. God wants to use you to help others know about Him. In John 1:40-42, a man named Andrew met Jesus, and his first reaction was to run and tell his brother. Andrew didn't know a lot about Jesus...he didn't have all the facts or all of the answers, he just told others that his life had been changed.

Right now, you can tell others about Jesus; you don't have to be a pastor or a missionary. In fact, God wants all Christians to be active in sharing their faith. This is called evangelism or witnessing. A witness just tells the judge and jury what he heard or saw. A Christian is called to tell others what God has done in his/her life. You can do this by sharing your testimony. Your testimony is the unique story of how you became a Christian. The apostle Paul shared his testimony with others - you can read more about that in Acts 22:3-21.

According to the Bible, Christian baptism is **an outward testimony of what has occurred inwardly** in a believer's life. Christian baptism illustrates a believer's identification with Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. The Bible says in **Romans 6:3-4**, "Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." Baptism is the action of being immersed or dunked in the water which symbolizes dying and being buried with Christ. The action of coming up out of the water illustrates Christ's resurrection. Whenever you get baptized, it signifies to others the public profession of your faith and relationship with Jesus. There are **two basic requirements** before a person is baptized: **#1** - The person being baptized must have trusted in Jesus Christ as Savior, and **#2** - The person must understand what baptism means. If a person knows the Lord Jesus as Savior, understands that Christian baptism is a step of obedience in publicly proclaiming their faith in Christ, and desires to be baptized, then there is no reason to prevent the believer from being baptized.




## #3 Read Your Bible



FOR THE WORD OF GOD IS ALIVE AND POWERFUL. IT IS SHARPER THAN THE SHARPEST TWO-EDGED SWORD, CUTTING BETWEEN SOUL AND SPIRIT, BETWEEN JOINT AND MARROW. IT EXPOSES OUR INNERMOST THOUGHTS AND DESIRES.

- HEBREWS 4:12 NLT



Don't get confused by all the different covers and translations out there – find a Bible that you can read and understand. At rest Church, we use **The English Standard Version (ESV)**. You can get this at a bookstore or on the Internet at **www.Biblegateway.com**.

Additionally, you can download **our app 'Church Center'** from the app store, **and then select 'rest Church'** and the **YouVersion Bible** is embedded within it. If you don't have a Bible, let someone at rest Church know, and we'd love to give you one!

As a new Christian, one of the most important things you can do right now is to read and study the Bible; studying the Bible is best done with your Bible, a good commentary resource, and a pen. Begin to familiarize yourself with both the Old Testament and New Testament books.

The Bible is the inspired, flawless, 100% accurate and true Word of God. This book is unlike any other; it's more than a collection of stories or just words on a page. It is the very Word of God written in the words of men.

**2 Timothy 3:16** tells us that "All scripture is God-breathed, and is useful for teaching the truth, rebuking error, correcting faults, and giving instruction for right living."

#### When you read the Bible:

- · God will show you things about Himself.
- God will show you things in your life that need to change.
- God will teach you what it means to be a Christ follower.
- You'll get a better understanding of your purpose in life.

If you've never read the Bible before, a good place to start is in the New Testament book of John. The Gospel of John is the story about the life of Jesus. Another good starting point is to download the YouVersion Bible app and start a daily reading plan that will help you begin to create the new habit of daily engaging God's Word.

Psalm 1:1 encourages us to meditate on the Bible. In fact, this verse illustrates that your life will be blessed if you meditate on God's Word. But, don't let the word meditate confuse you. David Nasser says that, "Meditating on the Bible is like marinating. Just like we let a steak or a chicken breast soak in a great marinade, we think on God's Word and let it soak into our lives."

As you read the Bible, underline words or phrases that stick out. Think about what it really means. Write questions down and seek answers. Memorize key verses and think about God's Word as you go throughout your day. And most importantly, start consistently reading. Remember, if you've got time to read this, then you've got time to read God's Word.

PRAYER IS YOU TALKING TO GOD, READING THE BIBLE IS HIM TALKING TO YOU.



Just like a football player needs a team, a Christian needs a Church. In **Matthew 16:17**, Jesus said that he would build the church and not even the gates of hell would prevail against it.

The Church was important to Jesus, and the Church was important to the first Christians who risked everything to meet together. You may not know this, but right now, in some places in the world, it's against the law for people to gather together as the Church. Christians are meeting secretly, with the threat of punishment or death hanging over their heads.

You need to regularly connect yourself to the body of Christ (a Biblical term for the Church). The Church is a lot like a human body; whereas each body part serves a specific function, similarly in the Church, each person serves an important role. Therefore, everyone needs to be involved for the Church to function the way she was made.

The Church is not made up of perfect people, good people, or religious people... it's made up of people who have decided to follow Jesus – people just like you.

So, why be involved with a Church? Just like athletes need practice and coaching, so do Christians. God has placed spiritual leaders in the Church who are there to help you grow closer and deeper in relationship with God. At Church you'll hear God's Word explained and you'll have a chance to worship God alongside other Christians.

You're part of the team all working together with one goal in mind of building the Kingdom of God. The Church will provide you opportunities to learn more about Jesus, and you'll grow in your faith.

If you want to get to know someone, you could read about them. But, you might also want to talk to them. God wants to have a relationship with you – one that is real and one that is personal. The Bible is full of invitations for you to talk to God. **You don't have to pick up a phone or send an e-mail to get God's attention**, you can talk to the very Creator of the universe right now, right where you are.

**Prayer is simply talking to God**. You don't have to use big words or flowery language for it to work. You don't have to know fancy terms or "Churchy" words; you can talk to God just like you would talk to any friend. In fact, as a Christian, God is both your Father and your Friend!

In **Mark 1:35**, we read about Jesus himself praying to the Father. Imagine that! If Jesus needed to pray, how much more do you and I need to talk to God? **So, how do you actually pray?** Easy, prayer is just talking to God. It's a two way, direct-connect, with no long - distance charges. It's a child talking to his/her Heavenly Father, and the ultimate direct message. Read the section below for further guidance on prayer.

#### TALK TO GOD ABOUT YOUR NEEDS



Matthew 7:7 says that we should always ask God about our needs.

John 15:7 and Philippians 4:6-7 talk about bringing your needs to
God. If He can take care of the birds, He can take care of our needs.

#### TALK TO GOD ABOUT YOUR SIN



**John 1:9** says that if we confess our sins, God will forgive our sins. In your prayer time, confess to God where you messed up. Ask Him for strength to overcome your mistakes. Even though you are a Christian, you will still sin and when you do, you need to confess that sin to God.

#### **LISTEN FOR GOD'S RESPONSE**



Nobody likes a one-way conversation. In fact, when only one person is talking, it's not a conversation at all. When you talk to God, give Him a chance to answer you. He may not speak with an audible voice or send you a letter in the mail, but He will answer you - if you are listening and walking with Him.

#### **KEEP IT GOING**



**1 Thessalonians 5:17** says to pray all the time. You don't have to be in Church with your eyes closed to pray. You don't need a Pastor or spiritual leader to pray. You can pray in your heart or out loud to God wherever you are.



#### **INVEST SOME TIME IN OTHERS**



God isn't Santa Claus! If all you ever do is give God a shopping list of your needs, then it can make you selfish in your prayers. Pray for others. Pray for your family. Pray for your Church. Pray for your Pastors. Pray for those who don't know God. Pray for God to create opportunites for you to share the Gospel.

#### **NEVER STOP BEING THANKFUL**



Thanksgiving is when we express gratitude to God for specific things He's done. Whenever God answers a prayer, thank Him. Thank Him for spiritual blessings, people, gifts, etc. You can thank God not just for what He's done, but for who He is. Part of your every day routine with God should be reading His Word and talking to Him. You probably can't do that with too many distractions, so get alone somewhere and begin spending time with God.

### LIFE BEGINS, ONCE JESUS BECOMES THE REASON YOU LIVE IT.

Statistics tell us that there isn't any practical difference between Christians and non-Christians. In fact, many Christians live lives that don't model the teachings, the life or the love that Jesus exhibited in the Scriptures. Unfortunately, this has turned many people away from wanting to become a follower of Jesus. It's crazy to think that many Christians' lives look just like everyone elses. So, here's the big question: If you have given your life to Christ, and you are now a Christ-follower, is there something different about your life? Or, are you really just like everyone else, with the minor exception of going to Church every now and then?

As a Christian, our lives should be radically different! Ultimately, we are not in charge of our lives – Jesus is. The Bible says that Jesus ought to be both our Savior and Lord. Nearly everyone wants a savior. If you're drowning – you certainly want someone to save you. Most people would be interested in getting all they can from Jesus. But, there's a huge difference between making Him your Savior and making Him your Lord.

**Philippians 2:12** says that one day "every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord." Surrendering to the Lordship of Jesus means that you willingly make Him the boss of your life. He's not riding in the passenger seat of the car with you, He's driving the car. **He's not the co-pilot; He's the pilot.** He is large and in charge.

In **John 13:13**, Jesus asked a very important question..."why do you call me teacher and Lord and NOT DO WHAT I SAY?" God created you. God saved you. He gives you all sorts of blessings that you haven't earned. But, through His life, death, burial, and resurrection, He has earned the right to be your Lord. **How can we be considered faithful followers of Jesus, yet be disobedient to Him in various areas of our lives?** Does Jesus have control of your life, or are you playing the role of Christian?

Here is the best part. When Jesus is Lord, you'll have an unexplainable peace from God. You'll **rest** in the fact that He is in charge. You won't worry as much. You won't be as anxious because you know that the very creator of the universe is in the driver's seat, and **He knows the way**.

Many of us have experienced this thought at some point in our spiritual journey, but we would be Biblically wrong not to share what God's word says about giving. Paul said in 2 Cor. 9:7, "God loves a cheerful giver." When we give generously and with a willing heart, God assures us He will watch over us and provide for us (Isaiah 58:9; Psalm 41:1-3; Proverbs 22:9; 2 Corinthians 9:8, 11).

Luke reminds us of

receive," The second
letter to the
Corinthians reveals a
number of inspiring
truths that should help
us become cheerful
givers.

### GOD IS GENEROUS = SO ARE WE

As Paul wisely taught in **2 Cor. 9:6**, "Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously." Solomon also stated this a thousand years earlier in **Proverbs 3:9-10**, "Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the first fruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing." And Jesus Himself told us in **Luke 6:38**, "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap."

The Bible is clear—we cannot out-give our generous God when we become cheerful givers. The only place in the Bible where God invites us to test Him is **Malachi 3:10** where He is talking about the offerings we make to Him: "Test me in this, says the LORD Almighty and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of Heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it." Simply put, our greatest motivation for cheerful and generous giving should be that it pleases the Lord and reflects His gift of salvation to us. We don't have a "give to get," mentality, but instead give cheerfully as a way of life. Being generous is for the Christian who understands the grace of our generous God.
